Dear Friends

Albert Einstein was once asked "What is the most important question you can ask in life?" His answer was "Is the universe a friendly place or not?" In the days when the Gospel stories were being written about Jesus the most important question in the Middle Eastern civilization was "Are the angels friends or foes?" The priest and writer Matthew Fox comments on this:-Angels were understood to be the driving force behind the elements (forces) of the universe. It is clear that like Einstein, the people of that era wanted to know if the universe was a friendly place or not.

I have the feeling that we personally are answering this same question almost on a daily basis depending on changing circumstances and how they affect us. It is easy to think the universe (God?) is out to 'get us' when life goes horribly wrong. We hear it expressed in the cry of "what have I done to deserve this?" All this sent me to the Christmas story and the part angels played in it. Let's look at a few familiar examples:

- The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a virgin called Mary. He said "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you." Instead of feeling pretty reassured and happy by such a visitor and such a greeting, her alarm bells started ringing. The first thing the angel said to her was "Do not be afraid ...". Put in terms for today this was the equivalent of saying "trust the universe".
- We can read of the angel visiting Joseph and giving him some reassurance about this relationship with Mary. The angel started by saying "Don't be afraid". (Matt 1:20)
- Then there are the shepherds out on the hills at night and they had their "socks blown off" when an angel appeared, plus being surrounded by the dazzling brightness of the glory of God (the cosmic energies of enlightenment, truth and beauty) and they were terrified. The angel's first word to them was "Do not be afraid".

Christmas comes with the reassurance that the universe is friendly.

DON'T BE AFRAID

It is often difficult to not be afraid. The things that affect us personally may be in the area of illness, accident, old age and most profoundly the fear of death. These are the really big issues, much more than fears of spiders or of flying. Yet behind these lesser fears we can see that they lead back to fear of the big issues—especially death.

In our world we are experiencing the onslaught of terrorist activity. The terrorists are creating and perfecting their methods to create fear to attack in unexpected places. You know all this. They aim to bring about division, destruction, death. Are we afraid? Yes and no.

Yes, we are right to be afraid when organized injustice is perpetrated against fellow human beings. It must be resisted. Yes, when we realise that our human behaviour is responsible for such conditions as global warming - islands going under the rising oceans. Have we the will to fix what we have messed up?

No—there is good cause to not be afraid. The universe is friendly. God is not out to 'get us'. Our human oneness with its underlying divine source has a power, an energy within it, that is the life force. A You-tube video after the Paris attacks showed a carriage on the underground train system. It was full of commuters going to work. A young man began dancing in the aisle. Before long 2 or 3 joined him. Soon the whole carriage was rocking (literally) as the people swayed and danced, smiled, made eye-contact and clapped. It was a dance of humanity. A statement of freedom from fear. An expression of Life and Love that can never be crushed and that never dies

A kind of footnote:

When the Bible says the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom. Don't be misled. The Hebrew language has dozens of different words, and we have only one word—fear. The Hebrew word in Proverbs 1:7 means reverence—not a cringing frightened attitude but deep respect and fearless trust.
